Minister's Message

It is my pleasure to introduce the Yukon Film & Sound Incentive Program Annual Report. The Film & Sound Commission's Incentive Program has been in existence since 2004 and was developed to support the growth and diversification of the film and sound industries.

Each year, Yukon government supports a variety of film projects developed or crewed by local filmmakers. From short documentaries and commercials, to drama and animation series, these projects allow Yukoners to further their individual careers, while introducing Yukon landscapes, culture and history to the world.

In the sound recording industry, the Yukon Film & Sound Incentive Program enables musicians to record professional CDs that further their musical careers and support sound infrastructure in Yukon. These products are a critical building-block to the development and success of individual musicians and musical groups.

Professional development is a key element of the Yukon Film & Sound Incentive Program. Through local industry support organizations, the Film Training component of the Program supports workshops that provide both theoretical and hands-on training to Yukoners.

The goals of the Yukon Film & Sound Incentive Program are to increase the level of film and sound recording production in Yukon, to maximize Yukon employment opportunities in the sectors, and to encourage sustainable growth.

During the 2007-2008 fiscal year, \$706,001 was approved under the Incentive Program to support a variety of film and sound projects.

Yukon Film Location Incentive

Total Approved Amounts 07/08 \$24,335

The Film Location Incentive encourages production companies from outside Yukon to film in Yukon and hire and train Yukoners. There are three components to this incentive program.

Travel Rebate

- Commercial and documentary productions are eligible for 50% of travel costs to a maximum of \$10,000, or 10% of all Yukon expenditures (whichever is the lesser).
- Television programs, television Movie of the Week (MOW), and feature film productions, are eligible for 50% of travel costs to a maximum of \$15,000, or 15% of Yukon expenditures not assisted under any other portion of the Yukon Film Incentive Program (whichever is the lesser).

Labour Rebate

• Television programs, television Movie of the Week (MOW), documentaries, and feature films (but not commercials) are eligible for a rebate of up to 35% of wages paid for eligible Yukon labour, provided criteria are met.

Training Program

• As with the Labour rebate, productions are eligible for a rebate of up to 35% of wages paid to individuals providing on-set training to eligible Yukon labour.

Yukon Film Development Fund

Total Approved Amounts 07/08 \$74,336

Under the Film Development Fund, up to 50% of actual Yukon expenditures to a maximum of \$35,000, or 33% of total project expenses, whichever is the lesser, is available to Yukon residents or Yukon corporations to assist with the cost of development of film projects in Yukon. The applicant is required to have marketplace support in the form of a broadcast development agreement or a distribution arrangement.

An additional \$10,000 is available to an applicant if the broadcaster/distributor requires more senior personnel, not available in Yukon, to be attached to the project.

Yukon Film Production Fund

Total Approved Amounts 07/08 \$500,000

Under the Film Production Fund, up to \$500,000/project is available to Yukon corporations with significant financial and creative control over a film project, to assist with the costs of producing the film in Yukon. The applicant is required to have marketplace support in the form of a broadcast license or a distribution arrangement.

For productions solely controlled by a Yukon resident or corporation, the contributions will be based on 30% of Yukon expenditures, or 30% of total production costs (whichever is the lesser).

For co-productions, the contribution will be based on 30% of Yukon expenditures, or 20% of total production costs (whichever is the lesser).

Yukon Film Training Initiative

Total Approved Amounts 07/08 \$40,800

Under the Film Training Initiative, up to \$3,000/person/year is available to Yukon residents for training for a career in the film industry. Applicants must have demonstrated a commitment to a career in this field (such as significant recent course work and/or work experience). Yukon film industry organizations are also eligible for funding to support local film workshops.

Yukon Sound Recording Program

Total Approved Amounts 07/08 \$27,530

The Yukon Sound Recording Program supports the Yukon sound recording industry by providing financial assistance for demo and full length sound recording projects. There are two intakes per year: May 1st and November 1st.

There are two components to the Sound Recording Program:

- Professional Demo Recording of up to \$2,000 for producing a CD with a minimum of 2 tracks or 5 minutes.
- Professional Sound Recording of up to \$5,000 for producing a CD with a minimum of 6 tracks or 20 minutes.
